

GREEN EVALUATIONS

BOWLS NEW ZEALAND GREENKEEPERS ASSOCIATION Inc.

A Greens evaluation Committee of experienced greenkeepers with the addition of a NZSTI Agronomist to help with professional advice in final selection of greens.

ROLE OF COMMITTEE: Prior to Nationals

On behalf of National Tournament Organisers the Greens committee shall interact with the local greenkeeping associations and Centre liaison officers within the Centre hosting the Nationals. The role of local representatives will be to assist the National greens sub-committee and to inform of any unforeseen problems, which may arise.

The committee shall inspect and grade greens on a consistent basis in comparison to the grading given to the **Headquarter greens** as set out in the **Criteria for greens deemed suitable for national play**. Where necessary Clubs will be advised on what corrective course of action that should be taken to achieve a green of suitable standard or consistency (e.g. green speed ditch specifications etc.)

Greens in all centres will be visited and graded at least three times prior to the nationals:

1. During Mid December prior to national event been held.
2. After Greens renovation during April.
3. Mid August/Early September coming out of winter for cover going into spring.
3. At the end of October prior to the allocation greens/event once final entries are known.

During Nationals:

Greens will continue to be monitored once play commences by representatives of the sub-committee or their Centre liaison officer. Player reaction will be noted and acted upon if justified.

To this ends reserve greens will be allocated within each region of play so that they can be used at a moments notice. **No green shall be closed or play transferred without the permission of the National Tournament controllers.**

GRADING CRITERIA FOR THE NATIONALS

Greens will be graded during:

1. At renovation – April/May
2. During August/September
3. During October prior to the allocation greens/event and once final entries are known. This is the most important grading. Past history should also be taken into account. For example, does the quality of some greens decline over summer due to high organic matter levels or other inherent problems.

Grading standard:

Likely to be used:

1. A = Very high surface standard, all green dimensions correct (e.g. HQ standard)
2. B = High surface standard, all green dimensions not correct

3. B- and C+= Medium to High surface standard, green dimensions not regulation (e.g. surface tends to be soft due to thatch, uneven draw, banks not correct height or ditches/banks badly need attention).

Unlikely to be used:

4. C = surface standard below par (e.g. weak areas/slow green speed), and or green dimensions not regulation, but with some work could be graded a C+ or better.

5. D/E = below necessary standard (e.g. 1/2 green size) or need major renovation (e.g. Levels, out side rinks unplayable).

Note: All greens will be graded against the Headquarters Green to be used for the finals.

Surface conditions:

It has been recommended that for natural Maniototo, Dioica and Starweed surfaces the following criteria will be used:

Greens must be true and level, coverage even, disease and weed free and Greens subjected to regular cutting. In many case this be will dependent upon species cover (**Green of dominant Dioica**) and cutting height this may mean daily cutting (**morning of play**) and rolling.

Green allocations and checking the standard of greens to be used and clubs need to know that as from 2011 green evaluations will be carried out with greens being graded as follows:

- 1 Grade "A" Greens being to standard for National and Centre Finals Standard.
 - (a) Green surface to be within 5mm of level in all directions
 - (b) Even cover of weed (Maniototo, Dioica, and Starweed) all over green.
 - (c) Green Speed between 16 & 18 seconds maximum.
 - (d) Bowls come back to centre line on all outside rinks.
- 2 Grade "B" Greens being to standard for post section standard for National and Centre fixtures.
- 3 Grade "C" Greens being to standard for section play for National and Centre fixtures.
- 4 Grade "D" Greens being to standard for Club and inter-club only. (Clubs need to carry out work)
