## Introduction

---

This report details NZSTI activities under the contract with Bowls New Zealand covering the period 1 April to 30 June 2023.

Activities include:

## Field Days Meetings

---

A total of 4 field days were delivered in this quarter, completing the delivery of the 20 field days of the 2022-2023 programme.

The respective field days are described below.

### Waikato

---

The Waikato field day took place on the 8<sup>th</sup> May and was held at the Raglan Bowling Club. There was an excellent attendance on the day.

Attendance: 24 NZSTI: David Ormsby, Maurice Symes (NZBGKA), Steve Beel (NZB).

Topics discussed: David Ormsby covered the topics of renovation, climate change new rules regarding Nema-cur nematocide, use of Acelepryn, sowing maniototo, cotula weevil and synthetics.

Maurice Symes gave a presentation on the training programme and an update on the greens in Gisborne following the devastating floods from Cyclone Gabriel.

### Bay of Plenty

---

The Bay of Plenty field day this year was held on the 26<sup>th</sup> April at the Te Puke Bowling Club.

Another good attendance was seen at the day.

Attendance: 20 NZSTI: David Ormsby

Topics discussed: Disease, sowing maniototo, nematodes new rules on Acelepryn.

## Gisborne/East Coast /Hawkes Bay

This combined field day this year was held in the Gisborne/East Coast region at the Kahutia Bowling Club on the 4<sup>th</sup> May.

Attendance: 10 NZSTI: David Ormsby

Topics discussed: Synthetic green, resowing and growing in new greens after planeing, general issues.

## Whanganui Bowls

The Whanganui field day took place on the 30<sup>th</sup> May and visited the Durie Hills, Wanganui East, Gonville, St Johns, Laird Park and Aramoho Bowling Clubs.

Attendance: 7 NZSTI: Andrew Mitchell

Topics discussed: As many of the greens had been renovated, the discussion focussed on what was done at each club. Nematodes and the installation of synthetic greens were also discussed.

## North Island Bowls Seminar

The North Island Bowls seminar was held on the 26<sup>th</sup> & 27<sup>th</sup> June at the Bowls Napier Bowling club. Approximately 60 greenkeepers and tradespeople attended the 2 days.

A range of topics were presented by David Ormsby and Brendan Hannan (NZSTI) and greenkeepers Rob Gibson, Jamey Ferris, Maurice Symes and Ron Sabin. The seminar also had a series of workshops as well as several panel discussions.

Some of the topics presented included:

- Greenkeeping the South Island way - Jamey Ferris & Ron Sabin,
- Seaweed Programme / Nematodes - Maurice Symes,
- My Greenkeeper portal - Rod Gibson & Jamey Ferris,
- 4 revolving workshops - fertiliser identification; weed identification; boom sprayer calibration and mower settings.

Brendan Hannan & David Ormsby, NZSTI, presented the following topics:

- Nematodes and how to manage them,
- Renovation and importance of time,
- Weed control,
- “Greenkeeping issues” that covered a range of issues.
