Notes for Bowlers' Attention

Laws of the Game

The Bowls NZ Laws and Regulations shall apply to any Tournament controlled by a Centre or Club and to Interclub matches and Club games.

Definition of a One to Five Year player

A One to Five Year player is any player whose membership does not exceed a total of five years.

Expulsion or Suspension from Membership

If the conduct of any Member shall be reported as objectionable, the Executive shall, on receiving a written complaint or may on its own initiative, take the matter into consideration and notify the Member of the complaint. If, after the member concerned has been heard, (if the member so desires), the member's conduct shall be deemed by the Executive to the contrary to the Constitution on inconsistent with the conduct, welfare or interests of the Club or such as to render the member unfit to associate with

Members of the Club, the Executive shall have the power, by a majority decision of its number present at the Meeting, to expel or otherwise deal with the offending Member, or to suspend the member for so long as the Executive shall think fit. In the event of expulsion or suspension, the Centre shall be immediately notified. If such Member shall feel aggrieved by the decision of the Executive, they may, within seven days after being notified thereof, appeal there from by notice in writing to the Secretary and thereupon within ten days a Special General Meeting shall be convened at which a report shall be presented by the Executive, the Member concerned heard and the matter determined by ballot. A majority of this valid votes cast by Full Members present (excluding Members of the Executive whose decision is subject to appeal) shall be required to carry out any motion either to confirm the action of the Executive or determine otherwise, and the Centre shall be notified of the decision of the Club. Pending the hearing of any appeal of any Member to the Centre or Judicial Committee, any penalty or suspension shall not be operative until final adjudication thereon.

Grading & Handicaps

Match Convenors to set Grading and Handicaps. Any Member may appeal to the Committee in respect of any decision of the Match Convenors, such appeal shall be in writing and addressed to the Secretary of the Club.

Complaints

Any complaints by a Member or Members respecting the staff, the greens, the catering or other matter must be in writing, addressed to the Secretary and signed by the Member or Members making the complaint.

Dress for Bowling

Open Tournaments and Championships

Creams, whites or club colours must be worn.

Skirts and knee-length shorts are permitted for all play.

Roll-Ups and Mini Tournaments

Mufti can be worn, unless directed by the Match Committee. Notice to be displayed on Entry Board one week prior to event.

All players must wear shoes or sandals

Heel-less with smooth soles. Check with Match Convenors if unsure.

Any player with a physical disability may use an appropriate support, wheelchair or bowling aid, provided that the same is so made that it causes no damage to the greens.

Conditions of Play

Players who enter Club Championship events may withdraw before 5pm on the day prior to the event.

Championship entries close on the day prior to the event at 5.00pm. **No late entries.** It is each player's responsibility to put their own entry in. Do not rely on others.

Championship and minor championship events commence at 9.00am on the green.

A player or players 10 minutes late after start time will lose game by default.

Match Committee reserves the right to alter the time of events if deemed desirable on the day.

For Bowls North Harbour Championships and Champion of Champion events refer to Auckland Centre Book or Notice Board.

Please arrive at least 30 minutes prior to start time to assist with set-up of the green and to allow play to start on time.



A short historical introduction.

The Oratia Bowling Club has been nestled in the Oratia valley since its incorporation on the 1st of December 1943.

For almost 80 years, the Club green has resounded to cheers and sighs as the bowlers aimed for the jacks. Many successful games have been played and the Oratia Club has been held in high esteem for its bowling prowess.

Many of the names on the honours board tell the story of Oratia: Nola, Sunde, Parkin, Whittaker, Simich, Allen, Marinovich, Tally and Vranjes to name but a few.

The valley was settled in the 1860s by Dalmatian immigrants making their homes and livelihoods in the yellow clay with orchards of apples, plums and grapevines. Other notable families had settled in the valley, descendants of Captain Theet, the Harre family, the Parr family, many names that carry the legacy of strong families that are still present in the valley today.

The land was purchased in the 1940s and the clubhouse built, only half the size of the existing club. Originally membership was only open to men; this has changed and women members now grace the greens and work on the committee.

A new extension was built in the 1980s that doubled the size of the clubhouse and provided a new kitchen and bar facilities. Hard work and community commitment built the club for the enjoyment of the Oratia community.

At the club's height, it was a vigorous and growing club but as with similar bowling clubs around the country, social trends meant aging and declining membership. This trend has impacted on Oratia over the last decade and membership fell as did the ability to maintain and upgrade the premises despite the best efforts of the existing club membership.

Recently, there has been a resurgence of interest in the Oratia Bowling Club from the local community. They have recognised the importance of the club to the Oratia Community as a place to gather and renew interest in the game of bowls, particularly by younger community members. The value of the bowling club is not only in the benefits of a sporting fixture, but as a place where locals of all ages can gather and enjoy each other's company. The club is open to wider community use and has regular functions serving the community of Oratia. In light of the renewed interest in the club, delayed maintenance and repairs are now being rectified. Fixing the leaking roof with a new one and the repair of the ceiling went a long way

to improving the interior look of the club. Further improvements are being planned and
