Conditions of Play

1. This competition will be played under World Bowls Laws of the Sport of Bowls (Crystal Mark 4th edition) and associated Bowls NZ Domestic Regulations.

1.2 Competition Format

Four Bowl Singles

Each game qualifying on Friday the 18th and Saturday the 19th of April 2025 will be played to 21 shots

On Sunday the 20th of April the following format applies.

Division 1 will play to 21 shots, Division 2 will play to 21 shots, Division 3 will play to a time limit of 45 minutes.

1.3 Deciding divisions

1.3.1 Finishing positions in each section will firstly be determined by the number of wins a player has.

1.3.1.1 If tied the player with the highest differential breaks the tie

1.3.1.2 If still tied the winner of the matchup between the players who are tied breaks the tie

1.3.2 The top player from each section will be placed in division 1 Quarter finals.

1.3.3 2nd and 3rd in each section will play on Saturday afternoon in a play-off game with the winners moving to the division 1 Quarter Finals. Losing playoff game players will move to the division 2 Quarter Finals.

1.3.4 4th and 5th in each section will play a in a play-off game with the winners moving to the division 2 Quarter Finals. Losing playoff game players will move to the division 3 for the Sunday.

1.3.5 All remaining players will play on Sunday in the Division 3 event.

1.4 Opening Play

1.4.1 The winner of the toss prior to the start of the match shall have the option to either take the mat and have the jack and first bowl or all the opponent to have the mat, jack and first bowl.

1.5 Re-Spotting the Jack

No dead ends, jack will be re-spotted as per Law 56.5.3 (ONE re-spot position) in the Laws of the Sport of Bowls. (Crystal Mark 4th edition)

Other General Conditions of play

- A Tournament Committee and Controlling Body shall be established by Bowls Wellington to conduct the event.
- The Controlling Body reserves the right to alter conditions if necessary.
- All players must be attired in bowls sanctioned gear. Strict uniform rules will apply and be adhered to.
- All other laws other than stated above shall conform to the Laws of the Sport of Bowls.
- Any point not provided for in the rules and conditions of play will be decided by the Controlling Body.
- In the case of a dispute arising, this will be referred to the dispute committee whose decision will be final.




